There are also negative aspects to recycling as well. For example, melting old plastic down to make new items can use a lot of energy. Because of this, some cities choose to limit what they can recycle and send general waste to be burned. While this is a way to produce energy, it also causes more pollution. Despite this, as long as we keep producing more waste, environmental damage will cause more problems and we will have less resources, so we need a way out.
